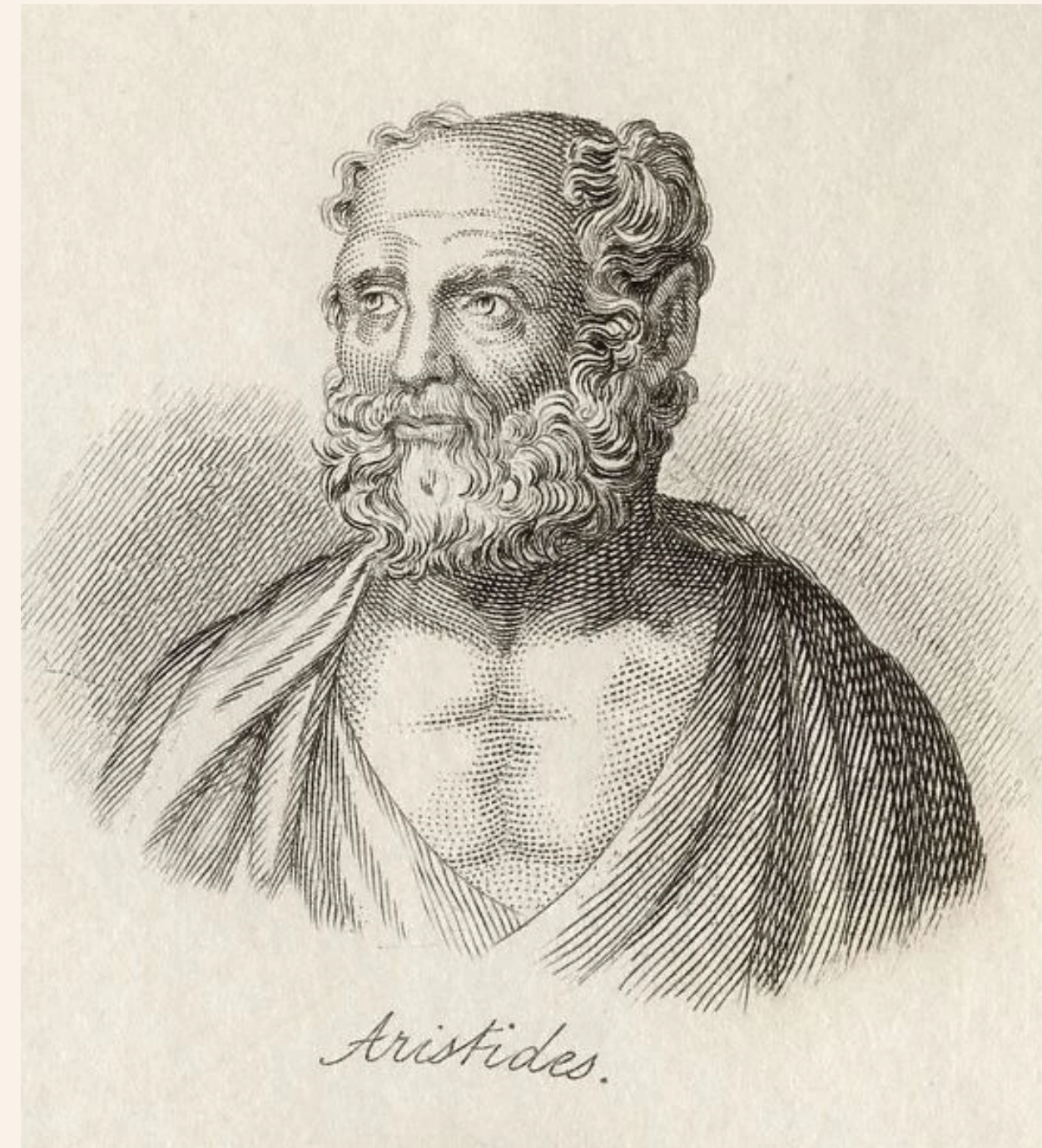
Aristides

The historical context

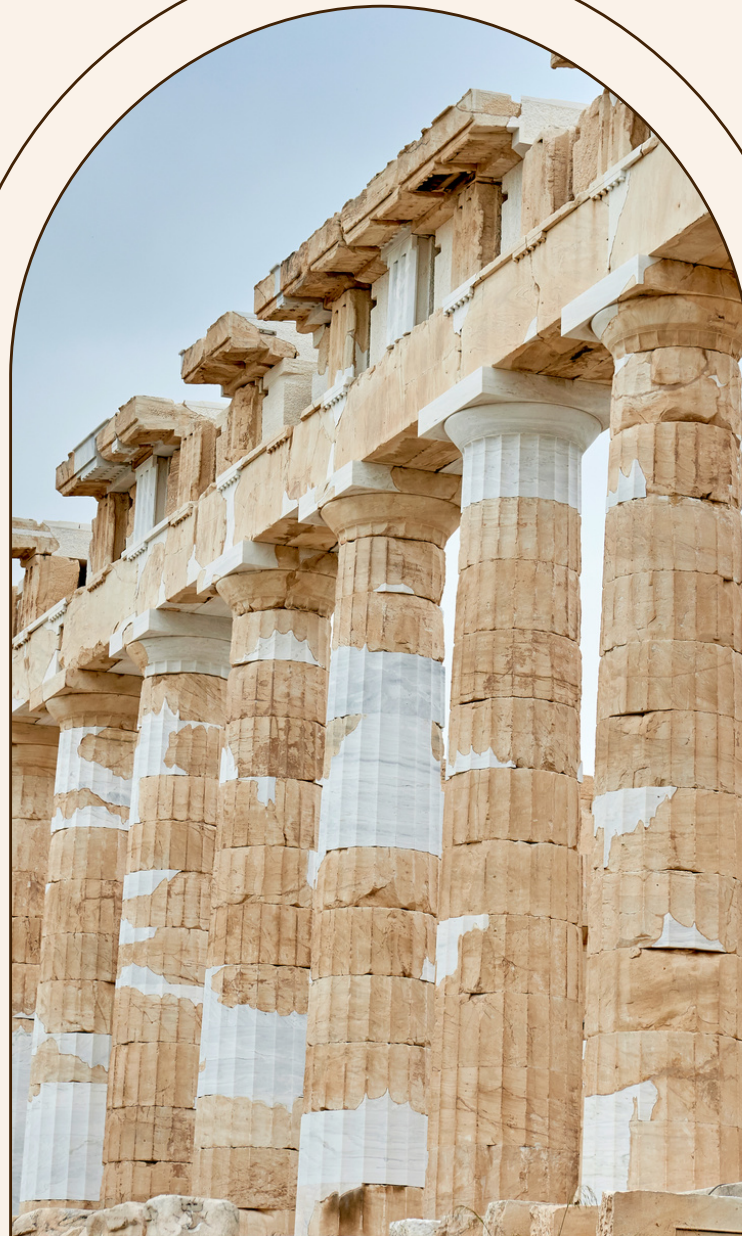

Aristides came from a modest background. His father, Lysimachus, was a farmer, and his mother's name was Tiaucheu.

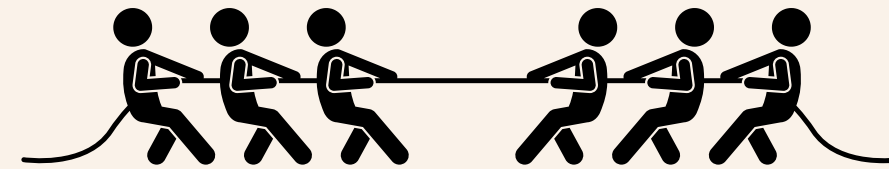


Persian War

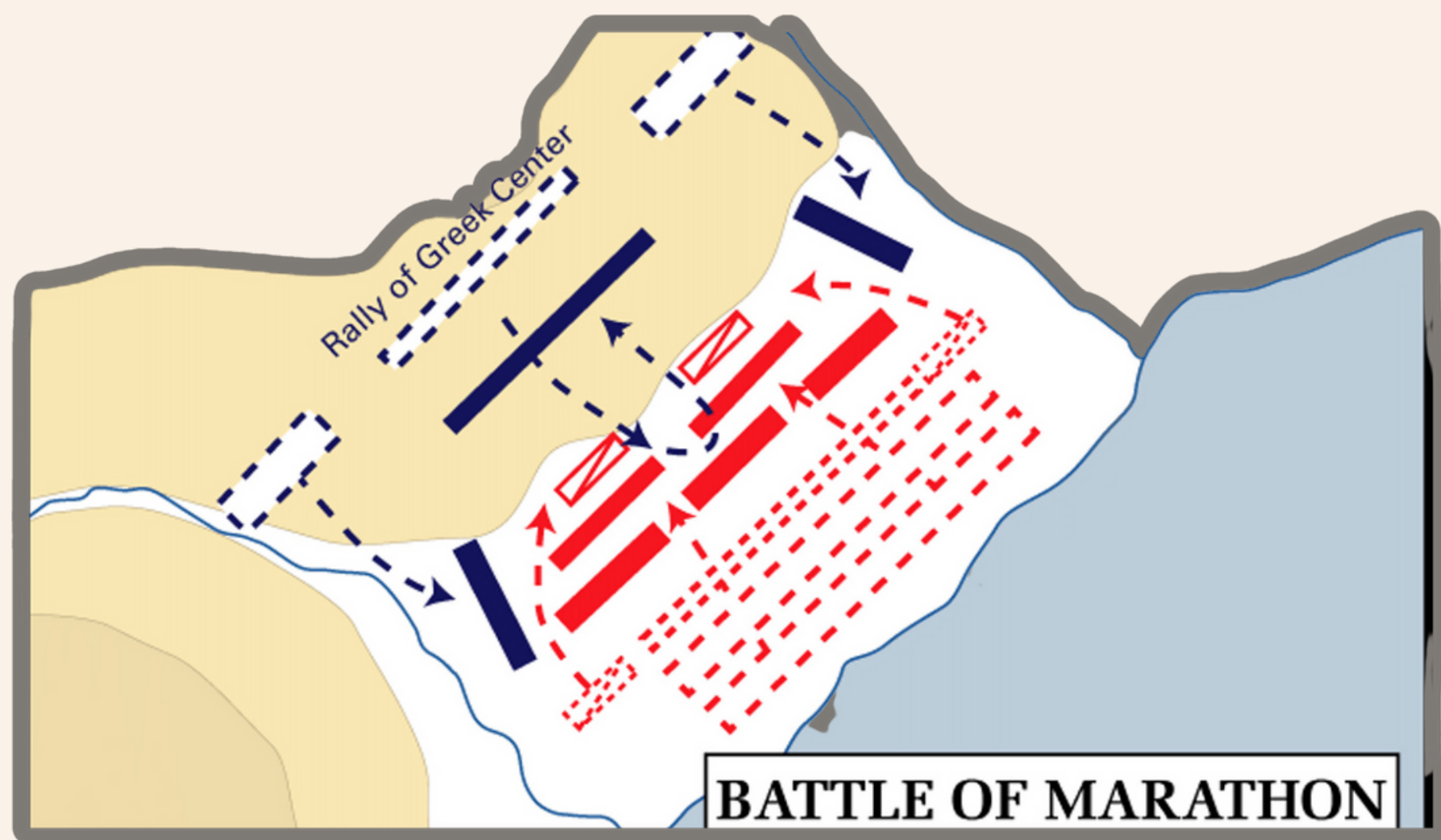

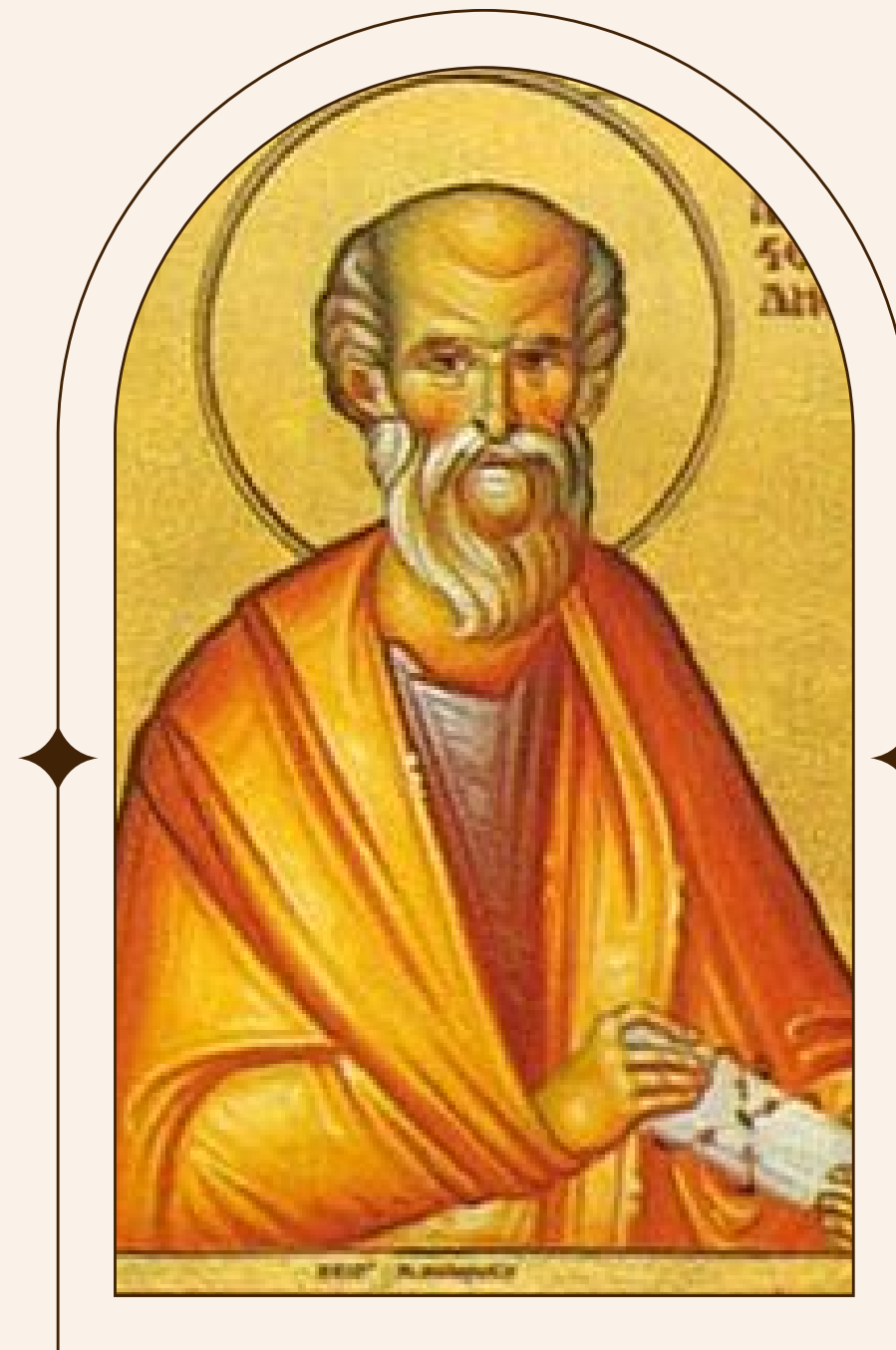

Preparation and Leadership

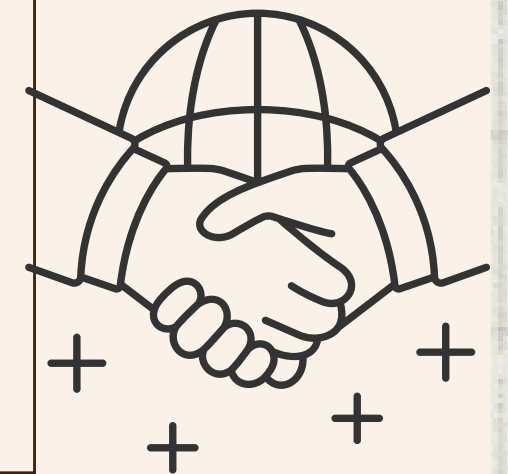
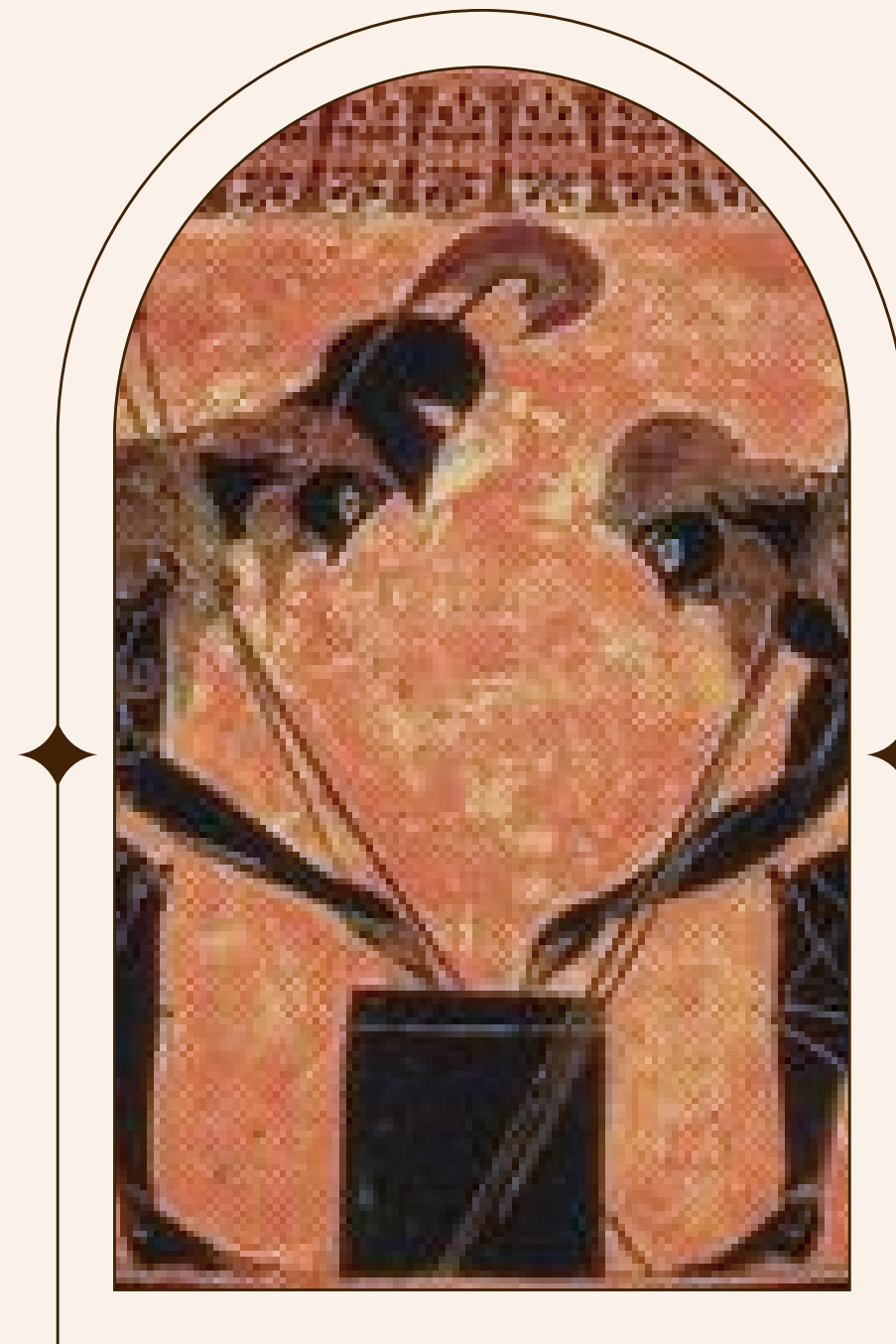
Aristides was involved in the strategic and logistical planning for the defense of Athens and was a key figure in rallying the Athenian citizens to fight against the Persians.
